On November 4th, the Church commemorates the Memorial of Saint Charles Borromeo, a figure who left an indelible mark on Catholic history. Born in 1538 to a noble family near Milan, Charles Borromeo committed to serving the Church from a young age. Ordained a priest on September 4th, 1563, he was later appointed Archbishop of Milan in 1564.

Charles Borromeo tackled head-on the issues of corruption within the Church and the challenges arising from the advent of Protestantism. His focus was to restore integrity and counter criticisms against the clergy. He accomplished this mission primarily through

It is no surprise, then, that Borromeo became the patron saint of seminarians—men discerning a vocation to the priesthood. Our parish is fortunate to have been enriched by the presence of several seminarians. But the responsibility of fostering these vocations doesn't rest solely with the clergy; it is the collective duty of the Christian community. Families play a vital role in this, imparting moral values, prayer, and the Catholic faith, which are the foundational blocks for any future priest.

This week, let us resolve to be proactive in encouraging vocations within our families and community. The absence of priests means the absence of sacraments; without sacraments, we lack grace; and without grace, the pathway to Heaven becomes obscure. By urging young men to heed God's call to the priest-hood, we not only fortify our community but also ensure that the road to Heaven remains open for all.

The First Joyful Mystery: The Annunciation



In this week's session, our second, we enter into the first Joyful Mystery, the Annunciation. This mystery is the anchor of every Hail Mary that we pray. More than two thousand years ago, the words of the angel Gabriel, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you" evoked Mary's response, her fiat, "Let it be done unto me, according to thy word." Today, these words continue to reverberate with every Hail Mary that we pray. This greeting and response changed the world. John Paul II said that the whole of salvation history, and the history of the world have culminated in this moment.

The host of this outstanding teaching series, Mark Hartfiel and his guests, will unpack for us the significance of this moment from the Angel's greeting to Mary's yes and finally to the Incarnation and the birth of Jesus.

In his infinitely creative mind, God could've done it in another way. But in his eternal wisdom, he chose to do his will through Mary. The angel Gabriel appeared to Mary and all of heaven, trembled in anticipation. Mary gives her fiat and our long wait was over! Generation, after generation of longing and aching, for the Messiah, comes to fulfillment. Jesus comes into the world through Mary. There is an explosion of joy radiating forth from the incarnation. 


rything has had a serious impact on our Food Pantry. We are extremely low on *meat canned goods*. Only one (1) case of Vienna Sausage remains on our shelf.
