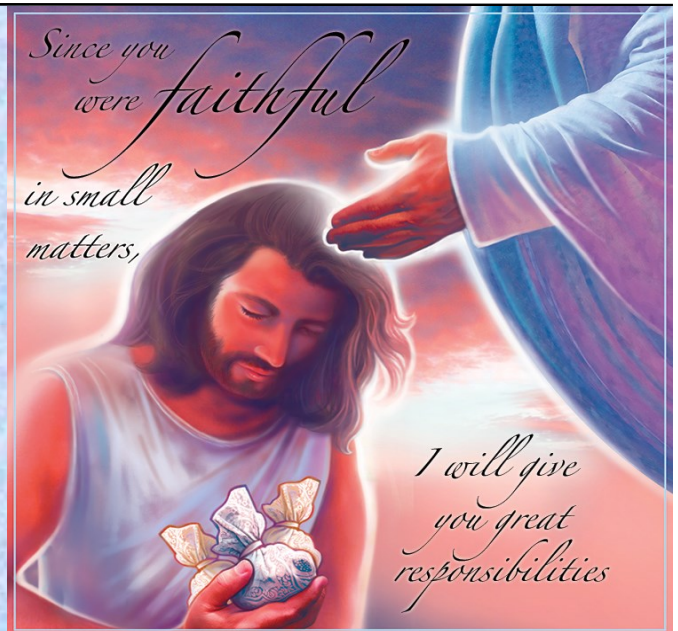

Dear Brothers and Sisters,



This past Friday, our parish celebrated the feast day of St. Elizabeth of Hungary, our patron saint. Born in 1207, St. Elizabeth was the daughter of Hungarian King Andrew II and Queen Gertrude. Despite her royal status, she was known for her deep love of God and her commitment to prayer. Elizabeth often chose to wear simple clothing, yet she carried herself with dignity and respect. Inspired by St. Francis of Assisi, she dedicated herself to caring for the poor and sick throughout her kingdom, often personally delivering bread to those in need.

After the death of her husband, Ludwig, Elizabeth was unable to inherit the throne due to her gender. Choosing to serve God more radically, she embraced a life akin to that of a nun, founding a hospital and continuing her humble service to the less fortunate.

One of St. Elizabeth's most renowned miracles was the miracle of the roses. On one occasion, while Ludwig was hunting with nobles, Elizabeth was stopped while carrying bread to the poor. The nobles, suspecting her of stealing from the castle, demanded she reveal what was under her cloak. When she complied, they found not bread, but a bundle of red and white roses—a sign of God's favor.

St. Elizabeth's life offers a beautiful example of selfless service. Though we may not belong to royal or noble families, we can still share what we have with those less fortunate. This could be in the form of money, food, clothing, or even our time. In doing so, we emulate the actions of Jesus and St. Elizabeth in our modern world. Through St. Elizabeth's intercession, may we aspire to sainthood by serving others out of love for God.

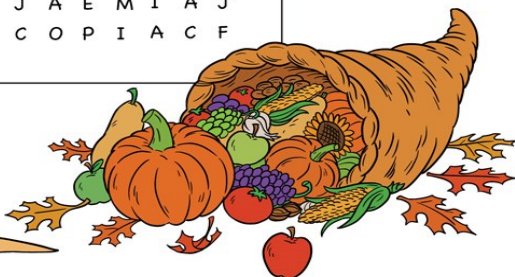
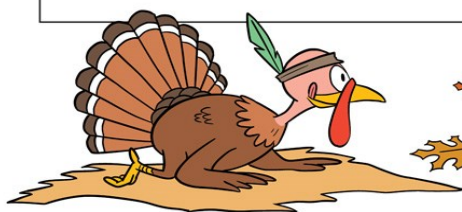

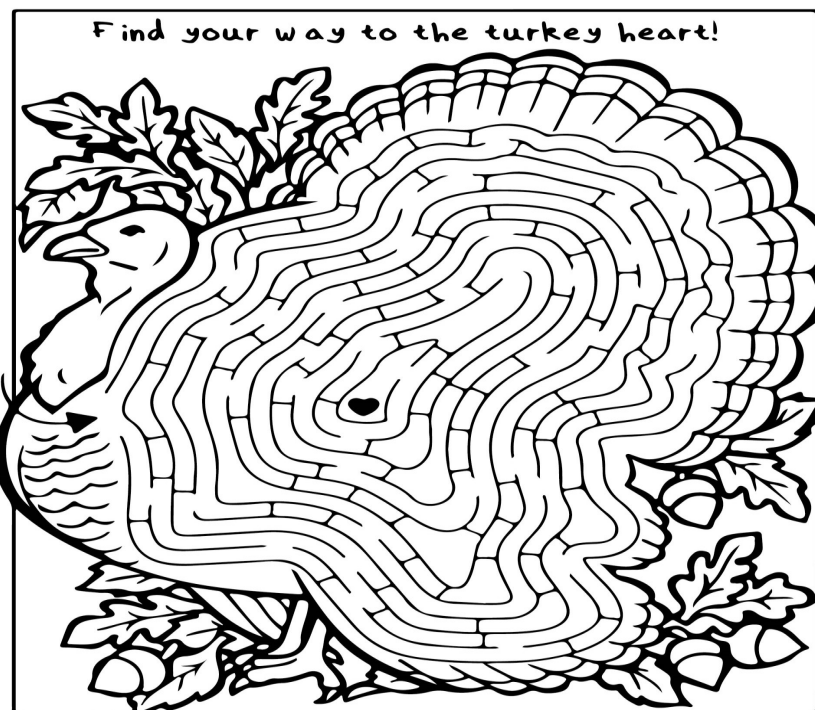
